Styles, Strategies, and EFL: Making the Match Changing the Face of EFL Instruction: Styles and Strategies for Success

- 1. You can change EFL instruction, making it much more effective and efficient in helping students develop English skills.
- 2. This can occur if teachers like all of us . . .
 - a. become more aware of students' learning styles and strategies
 - b. offer classroom instruction that is style-relevant
 - c. teach students strategies that make language tasks easier.
- 3. Learning styles and strategies can help determine how and how well students learn EFL.
- 4. *Learning styles* are the general approaches for example, global or analytic, auditory or visual that students use in acquiring a new language or in learning any other subject.
 - a. These styles are "the overall patterns that give general direction to learning behavior" (Cornett, 1983, p. 9).
 - b. Examples of style aspects are: sensory preferences, personality types, desired degree of generality, and biological differences.
 - c. Each style dimension (like extroverted ↔ introverted) is on a continuum.
 - d. You can find out your students' styles and plan lessons that address different styles.
 - e. I will tell the secret of how to do this!
- 5. Learning strategies are "specific actions, behaviors, steps, or techniques -- such as seeking out conversation partners, or giving oneself encouragement to tackle a difficult language task -- used by students to enhance their own learning" (Scarcella & Oxford, 1992, p. 63).
 - a. Strategies always have a goal.
 - b. Successful and unsuccessful students use styles differently.
 - c. There are many types of strategies.
 - d. Students should choose strategies that help them make their language tasks easier.
 - e. You can teach your students how to use strategies more effectively.
 - f. You can assess your students' strategies.
 - g. You can give students greater learning power through strategies!
