Objectives: This course is designed to introduce the basic knowledge or theories of English phonetics. Foreign Language majors are obliged to have the basic understanding of phonetic systems and to know how the sound changes according to different phonological environments.

Assignments: Students are required to study the materials in advance. They are also required to do homework (sometimes with partners) at the computer lab (Room 301, Humanity). Pop quizzes will be given whenever time permits. Performance in class and in homework will be a key factor that determines students' final grades.

Instruction: This is not only a lecture course; it is also an interactive discussion with students offering comments or creative ideas. Homework includes exploration through the Internet exploration and computer programs that help students understand the theories related to the topic.

Attendance: **No one is allowed to be absent from class for any reason.** If the absence is caused by irresistible factors **such as hospitalization**, legal, verifiable documents are required. The purpose of this basic requirement is to remind Foreign Language majors to be responsible for what they are doing and for the roles they have to play when they graduate from college.
